RECIPE CORNER. TOP TWINS NANA'S GINGER NUTS.

125 grams butter
1\2 cup golden syrup
1\2 cup sugar
1 1\2 cups flour sifted 3 times
1 teaspoon ginger sifted 3 times
1\2 teaspoon Baking Soda sifted 3 times

METHOD

Beat butter, solder syrup and sugar together until smooth and creamy. Add dry ingrediants and mix well.

Take a teaspoon full roll into rounds and space out on greased or baking paper tray.

Press flat with a wet finger.

Bake 20 minutes.

Be careful not to over cook as they burn easy.

Preparation. 10 minutes

Cook time 20 minutes at 150 degrees
